New Agribusiness Associate Degree in 2019

Increasing access to agribusiness higher education

Curtin University is offering a new Associate Degree in Agribusiness, developed in

close consultation with industry, at Muresk Institute from 2019. The two-year associate degree will provide you with an understanding of agricultural production systems combined with the business skills associated with the production, processing, marketing and distribution of food.



Admission criteria into the Associate Degree will be lower than for the Bachelor Degree in order to provide access to higher education for students who would otherwise not meet entry requirements for a Bachelor Degree.

The Associate Degree will be a pathway into the full <u>Bachelor of Agribusiness</u>, providing up to 18 months credit.

There will be admission pathways for a broad range of students, including applicants with vocational education and training, work and life experience and recent secondary education.


New Maritime, Ports and Stevedoring Resource



In January Murdoch piloted a 3-week <u>Horizon Summer School</u> for students going into Year 12.



You don't need to be doing ATAR to go to this Summer School.

In the pilot students spent their mornings doing regular class work and the afternoons were more flexible, with students working in teams and on projects.

The Summer School helped students to:

- ⇒ Learn about studying at university
- ⇒ Get credit points towards a degree at Murdoch
- ⇒ Prepare for Year 12
- ⇒ Develop their learning and study strategies

The students in the pilot seem to have formed a real bond and have stayed in touch since leaving the course. They also seem to have considered what they want to do when they leave school more thoroughly.



Independent Review into RRR Education

This <u>significant and thorough report</u> about Rural, Regional and Remote Education will help to inform decisions about how to address inequalities for RRR school leavers. re are findings about affordability and logistics associated with leaving home to go to uni or TAFE, availability of specialist career education in RRR areas and VET in Schools.



It also includes information about what government support is available and how to qualify for it. There is information about Transition from school on pp 23-34 and more, which includes recommendations, which start on page 56.

Summer School for Year 11s going into 12 at Murdoch

The Independent Review into RRR Education shows that those students are at a real disadvantage when it comes to knowing about and accessing opportunities when they leave school.

This program is not just for ATAR students.

If Rural and Remote students want to attend the <u>Horizon Summer School at Murdoch</u> accommodation can be made available on campus for about \$170/week. The student would probably be under 18yo, so they would need to be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Contact <u>Horizons Summer School</u> for more information.

World Skills VETiS Competition


