## WHY RESEARCH CAREERS?

Researching ideas for careers and training while at school is becoming **increasingly important.** With **automation of many jobs**, many unskilled jobs (and some skilled jobs as well) are rapidly disappearing. A willingness to **obtain qualifications** and to **re-train** when necessary will be vital for a young person's future. It is believed that at least Certificate III level qualifications (preferably higher: Certificate IV, Diplomas, Advanced Diplomas and Degrees) will be essential to obtain on-going work. Resilience, determination, and education will be essential to remain employed.

Remember too, the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) careers. Research shows that **75% of the fastest-growing occupations now require STEM skills**, and we must build a workforce of tech-savvy future employees. Digital literacy is vital for everyone – the digital revolution has led to many new jobs.

The University is introducing a new undergraduate **Bachelor of Design degree in 2017**. This degree will create new pathways for students who are passionate about the use of design and creative approaches across a wide range of disciplines and professions, and give students contemporary opportunities for their graduate and career prospects.

Majors available will be: architecture, construction, computing, civil systems, digital media, landscape architecture, mechanical systems, property, spatial systems, urban planning and visual and performance design. As a result of this development, the University will not take new students into the Bachelor of Environments in 2017.

The new Design degree will encompass a number of the **pathways to masters programs** currently available in the B. Environments and students interested in **environmental science and sustainability** will continue to be able to access majors through the B. Arts and the B. Science. Current B. Environments students will be unaffected by the changes.

LA TROBE UNIVERSITY NEWS

**OFFERS OF PLACES** – La Trobe offered places to **over 8,000 applicants** this year. Apart from the large campus at Bundoora, La Trobe is the largest University in regional Victoria with a total of 1,595 main round offers at its regional campuses, which is 46% of all Victorian regional university main round offers.

**'ASPIRE' EARLY ADMISSIONS PROGRAM (EAP)** – this program has been well received by students, with **587 community-minded students receiving an offer** under the program, an increase of 23.6% on the inaugural year. The university is planning to **expand this program** (more detail later). Some universities are looking at the need to restructure their admissions practices to promote greater ethical engagement among aspiring students and to reduce pressure on academic achievement.

**STEM - AN AREA OF STRENGTH AT LA TROBE** – For those who are unsure, **STEM** stands for **Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.** As you can see below, this is an area the government is wishing to promote. La Trobe University plans to introduce important initiatives in relation to these courses and career areas.

**RESTORING THE FOCUS ON STEM IN SCHOOLS** – The Federal Government committed an extra \$12 million to restore the focus, and increase student uptake of, **science technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM)** subjects in primary and secondary schools in the 2015-2016 budget. This built on the \$5 million allocated in the 2014-15 Budget. Restoring the focus on STEM subjects is about ensuring Australia's young adults are equipped with necessary skills for the economy of the future.

**STEM is everywhere**: our **homes**, **transport**, **food**, **health**, **jobs and leisure** to name a few, are all profoundly shaped by technological innovation.

Four key elements of the program are:

- providing innovative mathematics curriculum resources
- supporting the introduction of **computer coding** in schools
- an **innovative approach to education** based on the US 'Pathways in Technology Early College High School (P-TECH) model
- **Summer schools** for STEM students to increase the number of girls and disadvantaged students attending.

Students need to be encouraged to study STEM subjects to help secure the nation's future. Starting this interest at the school level will hopefully help increase the number of students taking up STEM subjects in **higher education** and in their careers, and help keep Australia competitive internationally in these important fields.



# **Career in Project Management**

There are so many similar definitions or statements of what a project manager does, and one useful website\* states that project managers *ensure the project is completed on time and within budget, that the project's objectives are met and that everyone else is doing their job properly. Projects are usually separate to usual daytoday business activities and require a group of people to work together to achieve a set of specific objectives. Project managers oversee the project to ensure the desired result is achieved, the most efficient resources are used and the different interests involved are satisfied.* 

The website goes on to mention the typical industries project managers work or are employed in –

- Software producers
- Commercial retailers

- Manufacturers
- Public sector organisations
- Aviation

Graphic Designers make visual communications for reproduction in print and electronic media (newspapers, books, magazines and websites). They also develop images for corporate use and advertising.

Qualifications can be gained from VET (TAFE) providers and at university. Many TAFEs offer **Diplomas** in Graphic Design (RMIT, Box Hill, Swinburne and Victoria University) as do private providers like the Academy of Design Australia and Tractor Design. University Graphic Design courses are often called **Bachelor of Communication Design**. These are offered at Monash, RMIT and Swinburne universities. At Deakin, the course is called the **Bachelor of Creative Arts (Visual Communication Design)**.
