News from Monash University

➤ **Pathways to Education, Science, Business and Nursing**

The following pathway courses allow domestic students who may not reach the required ATAR or meet the prerequisites, to gain entry into Monash:

The [Diploma of Tertiary Studies \(DoTS\)](#) and the [Diploma of Higher Education \(DoHE\)](#) are both equivalent to the first year of a university undergraduate degree and allow students to transition to the second year of their destination degree. Applications can be made through VTAC and students will be required to submit a **Monash University Supplementary Information form** 31 December 2016 if they wish to apply for one of the pathway programs. This form is the student's opportunity to outline their motivation to study, career goals and work experience.

➤ **New Bachelor of Business (Financial Planning)/Bachelor of Business (Accountancy)**

RMIT's double degree is believed to be the only one in Victoria that combines financial planning and accounting to develop the knowledge and capabilities to provide business, finance and wealth advice to individual. While developing specialist knowledge necessary to operate successfully in contemporary business and multidisciplinary environments, the program prepares students to provide holistic and integrated business, financial and wealth advice to the highest level of ethical and professional standards.

Graduates of this program will be a **new type of advisory services professional** who can provide **business, financial and wealth advice** on complex financial products and situations for a diverse range of clients.

The specialised studies in *accounting, financial planning and wealth management* will introduce students to the regulatory and global influences relevant to the financial services industry, and develop their understanding of *accounting, financial planning, financial products, risk management and investment strategies* that are essential to providing financial and accounting services to clients. In addition, students will have the option to undertake a six month internship to apply their technical knowledge and analytical skills.

Current Year 12 students should have the following VCE prerequisites: Units 3 and 4 - a study score of at least 25 in any English (except EAL) or at least 30 in English (EAL), and expect to attain an ATAR of 75 or more.

Bond Now App

Bond Now is a tool that allows prospective students to explore the campus and facilities of Bond University from anywhere in the world. Unlike a standard walk-through or campus map, the tour is 360 degrees, so students can fully immerse themselves in the environment and feel as though they are actually on campus. When demonstrating **Bond Now** the university wants the user to be able to explore the campus according to their own interests. The menu allows users two options:

Nutritionists and Dietitians

According to the Dietitian Association of Australia (DAA) - [DAA - FAQs](#), there is a distinction made between dietitians and other occupations in the nutrition and food science field, including that of nutritionist. The key difference between a dietitian and a nutritionist is that, in addition to or as part of their qualification in human nutrition, a dietitian has undertaken a course of study that included substantial theory and supervised and assessed professional practice in clinical nutrition, medical nutrition therapy and food service management. **So, in Australia, all dietitians are considered to be nutritionists; however, nutritionists without a dietetics qualification cannot take on the specialised role of a dietitian.**
