Twenty-One West Australian schools use ACER tests to determine which students should receive a scholarship. The test date isn't until 9 March 2019 but applications opened in mid-September.

If your child will be entering Grade 4, 5 or 6 (in primary school) in 2020, you need to register for the Primary scholarship test.

- Everyone knows what their role is within the team.
- You make sure you meet deadlines and let people know if there is a problem
- You offer to help others if they are under pressure
- You know about pressures people may have outside of work.
- You bring in the party pies when the team has achieved a milestone.

Those who tell me what a brilliant job they did leading a team, even when the question is clarified, demonstrate **they are not a team player.**

Anthony Wong, immediate past president of the Australian Computer Society (ACS), hosted <u>the ACS Industry Insights discussion</u> and said we are going to need 100k NEW tech workers in the next 5 years just to maintain our current standards.

He was interviewing Kumar Parakala, Global Digital Leader and Principal of GHD. It is worth considering Kumar's global insights at a personal level to guide career development in West Australian school students:

Kumar Parakala said:	Relevance to School Students
The number of people in the permanent workforce will go down. Business is letting people go, but it needs talent to take on new jobs. How do we reskill and upskill?	What is your favourite learning style? You can prepare by learning how you like to learn so that you can more easily reskill and upskill throughout your life.
As the global economy becomes stronger Australians aren't marketing themselves to the world.	What are your greatest personal assets? Learn how to market yourself through a great CV, joining groups that share your interests and learning how to articulate your talents in interviews or business meetings.
Digital transformation is not going to stop. As the need for technical skills grows there will be an increasing need for employees to have human skills.	Be nice!! Take time to like the people you are working with. It is common for really smart and really hard-working employees to lose jobs because they are smart-arses or pains in the arse!! People love being heard and valued so take your time will colleagues.
Have a higher purpose. As the type of work we do rapidly changes, having a higher purpose to work towards will act as your compass and help you to be resilient when things get tough.	What is important to you? Get help to unearth what is important to you. This will help you to make career decisions throughout your life.



Scholarships managed by the Australian Veterans' Children Assistance Trust (AVCAT) provide up to \$4000 per year, for three years, to full-time students at university, TAFE College or Registered Training

Marlene started the Nhulunbuy High

School VET Centre in a classroom. She scrounged furniture and equipment, went for grants, got business on board and introduced alternative programs that hadn't been available to school students and adults.

The VET Centre became an RTO within the school within Nhulunbuy High School. She significantly enhanced the human capital of Nhulunbuy which is one of the most remote places in Australia and was awarded VET Trainer of the Year in the NT a few years ago.

Now she has got this fantastic project off the ground.







- Family problems


There are specialists who deal with some of these barriers that are experienced by our most disadvantaged students. Making sure students have access to these services is an ongoing issue.

There is no program however to address the lack of internet or device access. Careers teachers need to build awareness of this disadvantage into their ongoing practices.
