Who is ACER?



Why mathematics and reading?

Student ability in mathematics and reading is fundamental for success not only throughout school, but throughout life. Mathmatics and reading form an important foundation for students' success when studying in specialised areas.

What's involved?

ACER Certificates comprise a one-hour online test that your child can sit at their registered school. Students will receive a digital report on their results and, if successful, be awarded a formal ACER Certificate along with a lapel badge to acknowledge the achievement they have demonstrated.

A fee of \$25 per ACER Certificate test is payable upon your child's online registration. Once registered your child will receive access to supplementary and independent learning activities via an online application to assist with their ACER Certificate test preparation.



For each student who sits an ACER Certificate at their school, the school will receive 10 per cent of the student fee paid.

Student registration opens Wednesday 1 February 2017.

Selecting ACER Certificate test levels

Research demonstrates that in any given school year level, student achievement in mathematics and reading can vary as much as six year. ACER Certificates in Mathematics and Reading assess knowledge and skills independent of school year level.

In 2017, ACER Certificates are available for students from Year 3 onwards. The appropriate ACER Certificate level for each student must be nominated by the parent or guardian at the time of registration. As a parent or guardian, we strongly encourage you to discuss the appropriate ACER Certificate level with your child's classroom teacher. Be sure to select a level that will challenge your child and enable them to experience success.

ACER Certificate Level	Recommended ACER Certificate levels based on Australian student achievement
5 (available November 2017)	ACER Certificate level 5 is appropriate for above average Year 11 or 12 students
4 (available November 2017)	ACER Certificate level 4 is appropriate for above average Year 9 or 10 students and for average Year 11 or 12 students
3	ACER Certificate level 3 is appropriate for above average Year 7 or 8 and for average Year 9 or 10 students
2	ACER Certificate level 2 is appropriate for above average Year 5 or 6 students and for average Year 7 or 8 students
1	ACER Certificate level 1 is appropriate for above average Year 3 or 4 students and for average Year 5 or 6 students

Note: ACER Certificate test level recommendations are only a guide and should be considered separately for mathematics and reading.

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
