Date of next review:	1 Sit the person upright. Be calm and reassuring. Do not leave them alone. 2 Phone ambulance: Triple Zero (000). 3 Give separate puffs of Airomir, Asmol or Ventolin  • Shake puffer before each puff  • Put 1 puff into the spacer at a time  • Take 4 breaths from the spacer between each puff	

4 Wait 4 minutes.

5 Keep giving ...... puffs every 4 minutes until emergency assistance

Commence CPR at any time if person is unresponsive and not breathing normally.

Blue reliever medication is unlikely to harm, even if the person does not have asthma.

## IF UNCERTAIN WHETHER IT IS ANAPHYLAXIS OR ASTHMA

- · Give adrenaline autoinjector FIRST, then asthma reliever.
- If someone with known food or insect allergy suddenly develops severe asthma like symptoms, give adrenaline autoinjector FIRST, then asthma reliever.
