## **Excursions / Incursions**

Our integrated topic this term looks at a Humanities topic called 'People in Places.' Throughout this topic we will explore places (rural/urban/surburban), their features and importance, special places, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island places and how to care for places.





As part of the 'People in Places' unit, we will be exploring our local community and the people and services that are in it. An incursion is booked for Wednesday 26th of October called 'Responsible Pet Ownership.' # Fnglish & Maths Focus - Jerm 4

We are getting closer to our Foundation students being ready to move on to Junior School. They will be expected to work more independently in Junior School, using their own initiative to solve problems, finish work, engage with their learning and verbalise their ideas, manage their time and so on. During this final term of Foundation, we will continue to develop these skills in the students so that they are equipped to deal with the next step in their education. Here are some ways in which you can help at home:

### English:

- At school, we expect the Foundation students to write independently. We rarely tell them how to write an unknown word, rather encourage them to listen to the phonemes (sounds) they can hear and write those. If they miss a few, it's ok - that's the level of their ability and understanding for now. Say the word in its syllables - hearing the smaller chunks makes it easier to hear the sounds.
- We have a large bank of words in the room that the Foundations are encouraged to go to if they need a word (especially the high frequency words). Because the word is there, we encourage them to find it and copy it, just as an adult would go to a dictionary to copy the correct spelling.
- Throughout the year, students have participated in an intense handwriting program where we have really worked on the formation of letters and the use of capital letters ONLY at the beginning of a sentence or when writing names. We have increased the handwriting expectations in Foundation this term. Please encourage your child to write on the lines in lower case, really focusing on the formation of letters and remembering their full stops. W
- Give your child LOTS of praise for having a go by themselves, just as we all did when they were babies and took their first wobbly steps towards walking. The word may not be 100% correct, but it is in 'their writing' and as we often tell them, "you are in Foundation, it's ok if you don't know how to spell every word yet!"

### Maths:

- We are looking for Foundation students to really know the numbers to 20 not just say the numbers in order (a 3 yr old could manage that!) but understand them - to know that 6 is 1 more than 5, to have a picture in their head that 8 is much bigger than 2, that before 10 is 9.... They should have these sort of understandings at their fingertips to be able to work with larger numbers as they progress into the next level. And the best way to achieve this? Lots of talking, counting, games, playing with numbers, cards, dice etc. Counting backwards is great too!
- Other areas of Maths are easily reinforced as you talk to your child and involve them in everyday things - talking about what items are heavy as you unpack the shopping, which is the heaviest? Tallest? Longest? Using lots of 'Maths' words correctly... sharing lollies for a lolly bag or biscuits between visitors, naming shapes around you, looking at numbers at the supermarket & money while you're shopping. Also looking at the time and using both digital and analogue clocks to tell the time. With them growing up in the digital era
