

Welcome to the 2018 production, 'Calamity Jane'. Again, a little later in the year than in the past, but it has given us more rehearsal time and a less frantic start to term three.

The production is always a monumental effort, with the bringing together of students from all year levels, to focus on creating a special and unique interpretation of this fun and engaging musical. This is the second production of the combined year 7 to 12 campus. As I look back on previous productions I'm amazed that we were able to achieve what we did with split campuses; it's much easier now!

'Calamity Jane' is a hoot. A new direction for us, a classic Hollywood Western that some of us can remember from black and white television and maybe some of our audience remember seeing at the cinema. The show has great songs and a fabulous lead role made famous by Doris Day, but given a new lease of life by our very talented year 12 student Lilly Betts. Calamity is a strong figure, working against society's norms in a tough and brutal world, Deadwood. I'm sure the brutality of the era is very much sugarcoated here in classic Hollywood style. I've chosen to heighten the overt very non PC references of the piece, to show that it was of its time, both as representing values of when it was first produced, in the mid twentieth century and what it shows about the way Americans viewed their past. Unfortunately, as in Australia, Indigenous cultures have not always been treated with respect. We (myself and the cast) debated long and hard about references to 'Injuns' and how to present very sexist views towards women. We have decided they should remain, as a way of demonstrating another era's attitudes, and, in the roles of women, hopefully the satire and intent will be hilariously obvious! There are still cast members who continued to groan at certain scenes during rehearsal, so I hope our comic intent is obvious. This is also a Musical Comedy of course, a lot of fun, so don't feel obliged to analyse!

As always, I'd like to thank all the teachers and parents who make all of this possible. We have a fantastic team of staff within the school and we are strongly supported by our Drama Support Group and Music Support Group.

It has been very pleasing to see students continue to be responsible for many areas of stagecraft, assisting with the running of rehearsal and being motivated enough to run independent rehearsals. Our principal actors have again been focused, reliable and dedicated. Within-school rehearsals have been maintained, a great tradition where we have all continued to benefit from the value of consistent student attendance and a much less stressed group of staff.

Calamity Jane is a rip roaring musical Western based on the 1953 movie featuring Doris Day. The title role of Calamity Jane is a terrific role to sing. She is one tough woman who was ahead of her time in terms of living on her own terms in a man's world of gun slinging, tobacco spitting cowboys.

The music is based on Tin Pan Alley/Barbershop style, being common from the 1930's to the mid 50's in America. The gorgeous close harmonies of the chorus and the heartfelt melodies of the solo ballads are evocative of this period of music. So too the rip roaring ensemble scenes of Deadwood Stage and the Windy City are filled with humour and move the story along nicely.

We spent 3 weeks auditioning singers and having acting call backs to ensure that we had a cast who would be able to sell their characters through their vocal quality and also acting skills. It's always difficult to cast a school production, as there were a great many possibilities, however you have to think about opening up possibilities for younger students and whether certain students have had lead roles in previous years and it's time for others to step up.

The Lead Chorus have been wonderful to work with. They are my trusted singers who learn their parts diligently and help the larger chorus by being rock solid with their individual musical lines.

The band came together quickly as the music is not too difficult and mostly in easy keys. It's always great to have students put their hands up to play in the band and this year is no exception.

I'm looking forward to our production this year and I'm sure the students will have a ball. All the best everyone xxx
