Approved Higher Education Studies in Schools

What are approved Higher Education studies?

The VCAA provides for very able students to have an opportunity to undertake an approved higher education study as part of the VCE. Such studies are recognised as higher education studies contributing to completion of the VCE.

How are my approved higher education results included in the ATAR?

If you are undertaking such a study, it may count as an increment (fifth or sixth study) in the ATAR.

Who should apply?

If you:

- Are self-motivated and academically capable
- Want a head start with your university course
- Want to gain a first-hand experience of university life
- Achieve excellent results in Year 11



The program provides an academic challenge and allows you to explore a particular subject area at a more advanced level.

If you are interested in participating in the Extension Program during Year 12, register to attend the annual Extension Program Information Evening.

This event will provide information about the application and enrolment process for the 29 different subject areas available in 2017 and will allow you to meet with academic staff who teach the Extension Program. There will also be an opportunity to ask former students about their experiences as an Extension Program student. Your parents or guardians are welcome to attend this event with you.

Australian Apprenticeships

What is an Apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship or traineeship is a *training contract between an employer and an employee* in which the apprentice or trainee learns the skills needed for a particular occupation or trade.

An apprenticeship or traineeship can be undertaken on a full-time or part-time basis and can be used as a valuable stepping stone to start a career in an industry you want to work in.

There are more than 500 occupations offering apprenticeships or traineeships – in traditional areas as well as a diverse range of emerging careers.

Why undertake an Australian Apprenticeship?

- ✓ You get paid as you work
- ✓ You gain "Hands on" experience
- ✓ This is a real alternative to tertiary study
- ✓ Creates a pathway Cert II to Advanced Diploma
- ✓ The training you receive is relevant to the industry

How long does it take to complete an Apprenticeship?

Apprenticeships used to take up to around four years, depending on the occupation or industry. These days, apprenticeships are 'competency based', which means that you can complete your apprenticeship early when you reach the required level of skill. However, <u>licensed trades</u> – electrical, floristry, plumbing and building – are not yet 'competency based' and still require you to be an apprentice for four years in order to obtain registration in that trade.

Surveying pathway changes at University of Melbourne

Students are reminded that they can either study a Bachelor of Design or Bachelor of Science to lead to the Master of Engineering (Spatial) or the Master of Information Technology (Spatial) at the University of Melbourne in order to become a Graduate Surveyor. Students who choose the Bachelor of Design, will major in Spatial Systems, and students who enrol in the Bachelor of Science will major in Science - Spatial Systems. Associate Degree of Arts

The Associate Degree of Arts is a two year, full time program specifically designed for students who would benefit from a supported entry to tertiary study. The course provides a pathway into university and articulates into either the Bachelor of Arts or the Bachelor of Criminology with credit for prior learning. The Associate Degree may also be taken as a stand-alone qualification. Associate Degree of Education

The two-year Associate Degree of Education teaches students skills they will need to be successful at university, such as communication skills, digital literacy, and critical thinking and teamwork skills. On successful completion of the, students are guaranteed entry into Deakin's Bachelor of Education (Primary). Students could also receive up to 14 credit points, reducing the number of units they need to study in their bachelor course – saving time and money.

The Associate Degree of Education may also be taken as a stand-alone qualification. Students are encourage to browse: Associate Degree of Education

These courses are targeted at students who do not satisfy the usual university entry requirements including students who have completed Year 12 but have achieved an ATAR score which is insufficient to gain normal entry into the bachelor degree. Applications for these two courses are to be made directly to Deakin University, and not through VTAC.

Deakin Ignited Scholarships

Ignited scholarships are aimed at attracting more female students into nontraditional areas of study such as Engineering, IT and Construction Management. **See**: www.deakin.edu.au/study-at-deakin/scholarships-and-awards

MUSIC AT SOUTHBANK

In 2017 the University commences construction of a new building for the



Conservatorium of Music (MCM) in the Melbourne Arts Precinct. It will help consolidate the existing MCM staff and students on the Southbank campus. The existing Conservatorium building will be retained at Parkville. The new building will include a 443-seat auditorium and a public square contributing to the community

space plan for the Melbourne Arts Precinct Blue-print. In addition, the Dodds Street Stables redevelopment will redevelop the Dodds Street police stables into a visual arts wing at Southbank, creating a new entry point to the University and opening the campus to students, local business and residents. It is planned to be completed by mid-2017.
