This is such a great program that lots of people apply so there is a competitive entry process.





WA Police Force Recruiting will cease taking applications for employment as a Police Recruit. It is anticipated applications for employment in these categories will reopen on 1 July 2018.

UNI NEWS

This month's Uni News is drawn from the Notre Dame Careers Network Day.


Notre Dame Career Development Network Day

The first Career Advisors' Day of the year kicked off at Notre Dame on 13th February. There were about 100 people there and these were the highlights that I picked up:

Notre Dame Early Offer Program

Rommie Maserei from Notre Dame told us about the Early Offer program. They had 600 Early Offer applicants in 2017. They made offers to 332 of them.

These offers are made in September and are not dependent on final ATAR results. Applicants need to ask their school to assess their predicted ATAR based on the Year 11 and Semester 1 Year 12 results AND write a recommendation. Early offers applications are due in at the end of Semester 1.





One teacher complained that she had to write nearly 40 of these submissions.... I bet that was a barrel of laughs after teaching year 12 ATAR all semester, marking exams and writing reports!!

Physiotherapy and Law degrees applicants needed to have a predicted ATAR of over 93 and all other courses needed to have a predicted ATAR of over 90 to be offered a place.

The school recommendation is read 3 times:

- 1. First cut
- 2. Before the interview
- 3. Before the final recommendation is made.

At the interview Notre Dame wants to know:

- 1. Why the applicant wants to go to Notre Dame.
- 2. Why the applicant wants to do the course they have chosen (at Notre Dame.)
- 3. What contribution the applicant makes to the community. (Notre Dame Early Offers go to applicants who want to make the world a better place.)

TIP: 93% of offers go to students who have been to an information event at ND.

Physiotherapy at Notre Dame

Physiotherapy is a very competitive course at Notre Dame. Physics and Chemistry and Specialist Maths or Maths Methods are good subjects to have before applying.

There are only 80 places in physiotherapy and 550 applicants. There is an interview as part of the selection process and applicants need to be able to say why they want to be a physio and why they want to do the course at ND.

TISC

Wayne Betts, the head of TISC, managed to make statistics and regulations interesting again!

He was proud of getting the WA results out before Christmas but said that there is.... NOW pressure to bring forward first round offers.

He wants you to let TISC know what you would like the offer process to be. You can do that <u>HERE</u>.



Some TISC dot points:

- North Metropolitan TAFE is now an associate member of TISC which should streamline the tertiary education application process.
- There has been a <u>change in some TISC terminology</u> to ensure consistency in uni application processes across all Australian states and territories. We no longer have cut off points and bonus points but ATAR Related Thresholds and Adjustment Factors. There are a few changes that can be checked HERE.
- → A lot of work has been done to ensure consistent information sets across organisations' websites in Australia.
- ⇒ People who already have a degree can now get offers through TISC in August.

NEW FUNCTIONALITY ON TISC SITE

TISC asks universities to give a predicted ATAR minimum to publicise to applicants. Registered users of TISC can plug their anticipated ATAR into the TISC site to get an idea about whether they will have a chance of getting offered a place. Wayne said he would check to see if teachers and career advisors could also use this new functionality on their site.

NOTRE DAME

Notre Dame is very proud to be ranked as secondbest university in all of Australia.



Rommie talked about their alignment with industry and the Immersion Units that are in all faculties which contributed to their success.



Notre Dame has recently bought Customs House in Fremantle.

This new accommodation will provide plenty of room for growth into the forseeable future.

ECU News

Edith Cowan University has welcomed the announcement of a \$50 million Cyber
Security Cooperative Research Centre (CRC) that is expected to position Western

Australia as the nation's new centre for cyber research and capacity building.

ECU, along with the WA State Government, is a lead partner in the new CRC which brings together 25 industry, research and government partners and \$89 million over seven years.



TIP: Cyber Security Graduates are highly sought after and well paid.

The 2018 written ATAR course examinations will run from Monday, 29 October to Friday, 16 November.

The 2018 practical ATAR course examinations will be scheduled as follows:

- ⇒ Saturday, 22 September to Sunday, 30 September (Saturday, Sunday and the public holiday included)
 - o Aviation, Dance, Drama, Music and Physical Education Studies
- Saturday, 22 September to Sunday, 7 October (Saturday, Sunday and the public holiday included)
 - English as an Additional Language/Dialect (overseas schools)
- ⇒ Saturday, 13 October
 - o Chinese: Second Language and Indonesian: Second Language
- Saturday, 13 October and Sunday, 14 October

Curtin UniReady Enabling Program COST

The Curtin Uni- Ready program is for students who didn't meet requirements to get into uni. I have got an enquiry wanting at Curtin clarification about how to qualify for "Contribution exempt".



Curtin Admissions has provided this information:

Historically, UniReady was only available as a contribution exempt program for all students – meaning that the course was funded in full by the government and students did not have to pay any course fees. However, over the last few years demand for UniReady has dramatically increased and there are no longer enough fully government funded places for all students who apply. We now accept a maximum number of government funded places and have also made available a domestic fee paying UniReady course, to accommodate those students for whom there isn't a funded place.

For the last few semesters we have been offering contribution exempt places (free places) based on:

- equity and disadvantage, so that students who have faced significant issues during their schooling or other forms of disadvantage are able to receive a fully government funded place.
- application date, students who applied early will be more likely to receive a place.

Once all government funded places are filled, we open applications for the Domestic Fee Paying Course which students can choose to apply for.

The majority of our students are in a contribution exempt place and do not pay any course fees; there is only a small percentage of Domestic Fee Paying students. These places are not funded by the government at all, and thus have a fee attached, which is currently \$7,500 for the course. There are over 800 students in government funded places this semester.


