

Alternative Pathways to Second Year at ECU and Curtin

If you complete a Diploma at Edith Cowan College or Curtin College, you are guaranteed second year entry into a range of university courses.

Labour Market Advice - from VET Careers Forum

Follow Occupations NOT Industries

Chad Lennerts, Senior Labour Market Analyst at DTWD, told the CDAA VET Careers Forum that health is the fastest growing industry but, to advise students to focus on occupations, not industries.

The industry relates to the nature of business, but the occupation relates to what the person undertakes training for and does on a day to day basis.

Sometimes there are very clear relationships like Registered Nurses predominantly working in Health. However, at other times it's not so clear cut, as with electricians, who can gain their skills and work across many industries.


1 Hour Per Week = Employment

Chad Lennerts also told the VET Forum that the International Labour Organisation (ILO) definition of employment (also used in Australia) is one or more hours per week!!!

He said that unemployment figures don't tell the full story. Any person who is employed for just one hour is not counted, even though they may be seeking additional hours of work.

Australian Apprenticeship Support Network (AASNs)

There are four ASSNs in Western Australia. These are the organizations that sign you up for your apprenticeship/traineeship contract and make sure you are getting the training you need.

Apprenticeship Support

At the VET Careers Forum, Tonya Reineks from Apprenticeship Support explained that ASSNS were created to address the high attrition rate of apprentices. At around 9 months many apprentices and trainees seem to drop out. The ASSNs try to




make sure applicants for apprenticeships and traineeships have realistic expectations of what they are taking on. The ASSNs also do what they can to support new employees through the first year so that they can get on a solid footing in their careers.

She advised people who want to get an apprenticeship or traineeship to register on Skillsroad which is one of the Apprenticeship Support resources designed to help school leavers.

Australian Apprenticeships Sites

There are two sites with very similar information about apprenticeships and traineeships. The Pathways people gave me this information:



The <u>Australian Apprenticeships website</u> is the Governments' direct apprenticeship and traineeship info website. You will find that a lot of the information is very broad and relates to Australia but doesn't go down to the state and territory

levels.

The <u>AAPathways website</u> is funded by Government funds but it has the freedom and the flexibility to go into more depth with the apprenticeship and traineeship information, run social media channels, and update the website daily.



You will find that we can provide more personal information and support across Australia and can also create resources quickly for different needs. We work with other government funded service providers at a local level to also create content and resources, adding to the depth of information we provide.

You can say that while both websites are quite different, they essentially complement each other.

Think Like an Entrepreneur

The FYA <u>New Work Reality Report</u> identifies *Building Enterprise Skills in Education* as one of the 4 key accelerating factors to gaining full-time work.

\$20 Boss is the largest national enterprise education program in Australia. It is for year 7-10

students. It works by giving students \$20 at the start of a school term, helping them to incubate and launch a business that addresses a community issue and then pay back the \$20 with \$1 interest.

<u>Enabling Enterprise</u> works with ages 4 to 18 years olds and features multiple industry touch points including bringing business and work into the classroom through project-based learning and challenge days, and also by taking students out of the classroom and into the working world through day trips.

An optimistic mindset

Generation Entrepreneur helps young people create their own work and jobs, while teaching them the enterprise skills they need along the way. They use a large network of entrepreneurs and mentors to run tailored events in entrepreneurship for schools.

Twenty-One West Australian schools use ACER tests to determine which students should receive a scholarship. The test date isn't until 9 March 2019 but applications open in mid-September.

You can check which schools use the ACER Scholarship Test HERE.

If your child will be entering Grade 4, 5 or 6 (in primary school) in 2020, you need to register for the Primary scholarship test.

Register for **Level 1** if your child is entering Year 7 or 8 in 2020.

Register for **Level 2** if your child is entering Year 9 or 10 in 2020.

Register for **Level 3** if your child is entering Year 11 or 12 in 2020.

Veteran's Affairs Relocation Scholarships

Children and grandchildren of veterans may be eligible for a Relocation Scholarship which is intended to assist students with the costs of establishing accommodation in their new place of study.



There is also a Student Start-up Scholarship which is intended to assist students to cover upfront higher education fees including text book and equipment fees. Students may be eligible for both. For more information go <u>HERE</u>.

Country Education Foundation Grants

The Country Education Foundation (CEF) helps rural and regional youth access education, training and jobs through grants, scholarships, support services and resources. Grants contribute towards apprenticeships, traineeships, cadetships, diplomas, certificate level studies, university qualifications or employment.

Grants can cover any education or work-related expenses, eg. text books, tools, work equipment, petrol, transport, accommodation, computers, internet access.

Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships

The Australian Government introduced new scholarships as part of its policy package to improve access to educational opportunities for regional students. <u>Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships</u> will support 1200 regional and remote students to undertake STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) studies. The scholarships are for vocational education, undergraduate and postgraduate students (Certificate IV to PhD) and valued at up to \$18,000 each.

RESEARCH

Remote student university success: an analysis of policy and practice

A child born in remote Australia is only one third as likely to go to university as a child born in a major city (Cassells et al., 2017). Moreover, of those who attend university, the completion rates are lower (60.33 per cent) than their regional (69.37 per cent) and metropolitan (74.87 per cent) peers (Department of Education and Training, 2017a). This study explored the principles of good practice that support the success of university students who come from remote Australia. To read the report go HERE.

Students with Disability Should Apply to TAFE Early

Staff from North and South Metro TAFE's Disability Units told the CDAA VET Forum that students who have a disability should get in touch with them early so that they have time to make reasonable adjustments to learning spaces.

They explained that if special equipment or teaching resources need to be bought or built that can take time. Students who don't give the college time to prepare the work/study space can be unnecessarily disadvantaged while the resources are prepared.

Informed Choices SA TAFE

At the VET Forum Jane Smith and Sam Bickell introduced the South Australian TAFE Informed Choices initiative which WA is going to begin work on this year. It is an assessment of the inherent requirements that applicants should be aware of before they choose a course.

As VET courses have national accreditation the South Australian assessments of student requirements should be equally applicable in WA. You can check the inherent requirements HERE.



Changes to VET RTOs

The <u>All Eyes on Quality Review</u> of the Vocational Education and Training systems was mentioned in the August newsletter. Some actions that are consistent with the recommendations are already apparent.

- Chook Henson told the CDAA VET Careers Forum that the Department of Training and Workforce Development has deregistered a number of RTOs for not meeting quality standards.
- It seems that the Commonwealth has already set up the recommended Student consumer protection services mentioned in the Review.
 The Services are mentioned in a video called ASQA's Role in the VET Sector. It is only 4 minutes long and is a quick way to understand the governance of VET.

Getting Better All the Time - RTO Auditing

At the CDAA VET Careers Forum, Chook Henson, Manager Private Training Markets, gave a solid rundown of training planning for the next triennium which begins in 2020.

He explained that there are some new RTOs in the market to deliver courses that weren't available in WA and he said that a number of RTOs have been taken out of the market as they didn't meet quality standards.

Chook is always refreshing to listen to and straight to the point. He explained that there are about 150 private RTOs in WA that have been doing a good job, there are about 30 that are being supported to improve their game, and there is a small group that are being tightly monitored as they seem more interested in making money that in delivering quality training.

RESEARCH

Another fantastic report from the Mitchell Institute.

As alternative pathways to university disrupt senior school programs this report, released on 30th July, has recommendations for a way forward.

"The biggest issue in creating partnerships is often the paperwork and difficulty in finding how a partnership can be mutually beneficial." (p18)

One of the key themes of the Report relates to the challenges schools and teachers have in prioritising industry partnerships in busy school environments.



If school-industry partnerships are to be a priority in all schools – then industry engagement needs to first be prioritised at the system level. Rather than adding on more requirements for schools to deliver, this would mean education systems recognising the broader outcomes that industry partnerships contribute to, such as lifting career aspirations and increasing engagement in learning. (p19)

Skills for a Global Future

The impact of automation will be to change, rather than replace, most jobs. Workers will need to frequently undertake training to keep their skills up to date, particularly their technical skills, so that they remain employable as their jobs evolve. This is already the case as the number of machinery operators and drivers, and of labourers has declined.

Need for Digital Skills



Employers are dissatisfied with the digital skills of VET graduates who they expect to have advanced technical skills. These skills are frequently an elective competency in a course rather than a core skill and students and RTOs are not yet responding to industry demands.

Soft Skills

In addition to the ongoing updating of technical expertise employers are demanding communication, entrepreneurial and creativity and willingness to experiment.
