## **Soft Plastic Recycling**

RED Group, a Melbourne-based consulting and recycling organisation, has developed and implemented the REDcycle Program; a recovery initiative for post-consumer soft plastic. RED Group has teamed up with Coles, Woolworths and some of Australia's most-loved brands to make it easy for you to keep your plastic bags and soft plastic packaging out of landfill. The REDcycle Program is true product stewardship model where manufacturers, retailers and consumers are sharing responsibility in creating a sustainable future. Through RedCycle we are able to recycle our unwanted soft plastics like glad bags, cling wrap and supermarket bags and turn them into hard plastic furniture and playground equipment.

## **Recycle with Mondo**

Recycle with Mondo is a Melbourne based company that collect unwanted clothing items to be upcycled, reused or recycled. The company works with schools and organisations to organise collection days. For each kilogram of unwanted clothing collected the school receives 10c. This is a great opportunity to clean out those cupboards and dispose of unwanted clothing in an environmentally friendly way. A collection area will be set up in the foyer, opposite the canteen, in Week 10 this term from Monday 19th - Friday 23rd June. Our collection day will be Monday 26th June mid morning. So go through your unwanted and used clothing items and bring them into school in Week 10 and assist us with not only helping the environment but putting some money into our environment club budget!
